Late preterm infants are at high risk for feeding challenges and early cessation of direct breastfeeding. This session will pick up where Part I in October 2025 left off on providing participants with an understanding of late preterm neurologic, muscular, and physiologic development after birth for comprehensive family education. Participants will learn feeding strategies to promote infant development while protecting milk production and infant growth.
